### Rose Day Programme

The Rose Day programme has been an integral part of Goostrey Rose Day for as long as anyone can remember. It is a souvenir which people treasure and keep and it is a tradition that the Rose Day Committee is determined to maintain.

A few years ago, because programme sales were declining and we wanted to ensure as many people as possible saw the advertisements placed by supportive local businesses, we decided not to charge for the programme. This move proved popular with both villagers and advertisers but it meant that the programme cost us a great deal of time, selling the scores of adverts, ensuring they were correct and met the needs of the advertisers, without making a contribution to the Rose Day funds.

So, we have decided that this year the programme will carry no advertising and we have adopted a shorter format that will still give people all the information they need.

We hope you appreciate this new look but we would love to know what you think in order to help us decide our approach going forward.



# Rose Day - The Covid Years

Because of the Covid pandemic, this is the first full-scale Goostrey Rose Day since June 2019. However, during the past two years, the committee has worked hard to keep the tradition alive and ensure Rose Day remained the most important date in the village diary. In 2020 all the usual events had to be cancelled but we were able to organise a mini procession which included a traction engine that led an array of vehicles including a steam roller, a line of vintage tractors and a campervan carrying the Rose Bud Queen Rose Worsley who placed a bouquet of flowers from her own garden on the war memoral. The procession also included a special float carrying 98-year-old Margaret Kettle who takes part every year.

> In 2021 the restrictions were eased slightly but again the main event had to be cancelled. The Rose Queen Cate Clayton and Rosebud Queen Rose Worsley who were chosen in March 2020, were crowned in a short ceremony on the grassed area off Booth Bed Lane, opposite Meadow Avenue.

> The girls wearing their crowns and accompanied by their attendants then formed a small procession which went down Main Road and the Rose Queen laid a wreath at the War Memorial.

> Both years all the usual craft competitions took place and villagers decorated their gardens with banners and buntings and there was a special Rose Day programme broadcast on Dane Sound Radio.

> One of the successes of the past two years was the delivery of small cakes, on behalf of the Rose Queen to residents who were isolating because of the Covid pandemic. If you know someone who is less able to leave home and may miss out on this year's event, why not buy them a small bun or a slice of cake from the stall on the field and take it to them, so they don't feel they are totally isolated.

# Rose Day Patrons

Although we have not been able to organise a full-scale Rose Day since 2019, our long-term patrons have been exceptionally supportive and we have also been lucky enough to attract new ones. Whilst there is no fixed fee to become a patron a commitment of at least £30 a year for a household would help enormously. #### Ceilidh

Tickets for Ceilidh will be available until Wednesday 22 June. Adults £18, children under 12 £8. Bring your own drink and (plastic) glasses. For tickets contact Peter Gomes on 07867 798848.

#### Wrist Bands

In order to speed up access to the field, especially for parents with children in the procession, wrist bands costing £2.50 for adults and £1 for concessions (children are free) will be available from the Trading Post in the run up to Rose Day. They will also be available before the floats set off from Booth Bed Lane and outside the Crown before the procession arrives.

#### Road Closure

Main Road will be closed between Booth Bed Lane and the Church from 1pm - 2pm on Rose Day and access to Booth Bed Lane from Main Road to Booth Bed Lane will not be permitted from 12noon until the procession has left.

#### **Procession**

Please ensure that all children taking part in the procession arrive at the starting point on Booth Bed Lane from 12.30pm so that procession can leave promptly at 1pm. For safety reasons and in order to ensure that all on-lookers can see, only marshals are permitted to walk alongside the floats.

#### **Prayers at the War Memorial**

The Rose Queen and her entourage will process to the church for the traditional prayers and wreath laving with the Rev Heather Buckley

#### Car Parking

Please use the field opposite the Crown (accessed before the procession by the roundabout at the bottom of the school field) or the special facility behind the Red Lion. Only cars with special permits and disabled drivers will be allowed on the Village Hall car park.

The Rose Festival celebration service at St Luke's Church is on Sunday 26th June at 10 30am. All are welcome.
